### **Submission Guidelines**

#### **Word Limit**

The prescribed word limits for the submission of articles/research papers are 5000-6000 words including footnotes. The articles/research papers must accompany an abstract in about 150- 200 words along with a declaration that the article/research paper has not been published or sent for publication elsewhere.

## **Authorship**

Entries can be co-authored. However, a maximum of two authors per entry is allowed. Entries from all aspects of law whether direct or applied are welcome.

## **Main Text**

Submission must be in MS Word. Times New Roman, font size spacing 1.5 and justified with a margin of 1.5 inch in left and 1.0 inch in Right, top and bottom.

## **Footnotes**

Times New Roman, font size 10, spacing 1.0 and justified. Footnotes must be substantive.

## **Citation**

The citation style in the articles and notes and comments submitted for publication in KaLJ shall be in conformity with the JILI Footnoting, available at: [www.ili.ac.in/cstyle.pdf](http://www.ili.ac.in/cstyle.pdf).
