

## Notes on Contributors

- **Prof. (Dr.) Anju Vali Tikoo** is the Professor-in-Charge of Law Centre-1, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi. Having pursued her legal education from the University of Delhi, she joined her alma mater in 1989 as a lecturer and has teaching experience of more than 33 years. She is a Former Professor of Law at the National Law University, Delhi where she taught Law of Crimes and Advanced Jurisprudence to LL.B. and LL.M. students from 2009-2012. Her areas of research interests are Criminal Laws, Women and Child Laws, Gender Justice, Public Health Laws, Criminology and Victimology. Prof. Tikoo's PhD (2003) was on Organ Transplant Law. Recognising her contribution, the High Court of Delhi appointed her as *amicus curiae* to assist the Court in framing rules and guidelines for the implementation of the THOTA Act, 1994. She was a consultant for the International project of BRICS Countries on 'Right to Health: Bridges to Sanitary Democracy' (2012-2014). She was also invited as a resource person by the Menon Committee constituted to suggest reforms in Criminal Laws in 2007. Prof. Tikoo has authored three books. Prof. Tikoo has contributed modules in UGC E-pathshala Course on Criminology and papers in the area of criminology, victimology, and public health laws in reputed journals. She has been the visiting faculty in various prestigious institutions. She has been the resource person in several national and international Seminars/Workshops.

He is working on his next book project titled “Legal and Policy Framework of Precision Medicine” (Springer 2023-24). He also published numerous articles, book chapters, reviews and policy briefs on intellectual property and biotechnology law.

He participated as a resource person/panellist/invited speaker to international and national forums in workshops, conferences, seminars and government consultative groups on IP and biomedical law (viz. University of Copenhagen, Faculty of Law, Denmark; University of York, Global Strategy Lab, Canada; McGill University, Centre of Genomics and Policy, Canada; Texas A&M University, USA; University of Utah, Faculty of Law, USA; FICCI, ONGC, RIS, RGNIPM, IP Office India, DIPP/DPIIT Govt. of India, Ministry of Commerce & Industry). On 18th December 2021, he was conferred with the “International Teaching Excellence Award 2021 in Intellectual Property Law” by the Center for Professional Advancement (A Unit of IMRF registered with Govt. of India NITI Aayog).

- **Hon’ble Mr. Justice S. Abdul Nazeer** is a former judge of the Supreme Court of India, who is serving as the 24th Governor of Andhra Pradesh. He is also former judge of the Karnataka High Court. He was appointed as the Governor of Andhra Pradesh on 12 February 2023. Justice Nazeer enrolled as an advocate on February 18th, 1983. He litigated for 20 years at the Karnataka High Court. In 2003, he was appointed as an Additional Judge of the Karnataka High Court and one year later he was made a Permanent Judge. On February 17th, 2017 Justice Nazeer was elevated to the Supreme Court. He is the third judge to be directly elevated to the Supreme Court without serving as the Chief Justice of a High Court. Justice Nazeer retired on January 4th, 2023 after serving a 6-year term at the Supreme Court. During his tenure, Justice Nazeer sat on 458 benches and authored 93 judgments.
- **Shailesh Kumar Pandey** is a Ph.D. Candidate at the Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur.
- **Prof. (Dr.) Prabhakar Singh** is professor and associate dean for research at the School of Law, BML Munjal University. Prabhakar teaches and researches public international law, Third World approaches to International Law, legal
